## CONGRATULATIONS TO ED AND JOAN MCKNIGHT WHO CELEBRATED 60 YEARS OF MARRIAGE ON THURSDAY!

I asked them to give a brief reflection on sixty years of holy matrimony – here is their response in their own words:

“Joan and Ed both went to the same Junior High School, never attending the same classes. After graduation in 1951 Joan went to an all-girls High School and Ed to an all-boys. There was an accidental meeting (actually God’s Plan) during a summer’s evening stroll on August 10, 1952. While walking Joan home that night, Ed suggested a friendly return visit. That friendly “return visit” has lasted approximately 23,688 days. On June 15, 1957, the warmest day of the summer, a 21 year old lovely young lady by the name of Joan Ellen Beers, yes Beers, married a 20 year old red head, soon to be a Police Officer named Ed McKnight. When we made our vows, there was never, ever, ever any thought that it was for anything but our entire lives. In our first home that was just twelve feet wide on a little street in Kensington, there was a plaque Joan set up that you saw every time you went up or down the stairs, ‘Only one life will soon be past, only what’s done for Christ will last.’ Appreciation, Respect, Faith in God were the guidelines, and so far they have been successful ones. While all those days passed so swiftly, there were many that seemed to never end, not the good ones, the ones we all share: difficult, scary and painful days that we regret, yet remember. In Joan’s wedding ring there is an inscription, ‘Love is eternal.’ That says it all because God is eternal and so is His love for us.”
